

## Community Bushwalk at the Macclesfield Lagoons

The Macclesfield Lagoons were built in the mid 1980's to store and treat the town's effluent. The surrounding land was leased to farmers until about 6 years ago when it was decided to treat the land as a conservation area. This 40ha parcel of regenerating remnant has a diverse range of native plants and animals.

Come along to explore the environment surrounding the lagoons and see another biodiversity hotspot close to Macclesfield.
