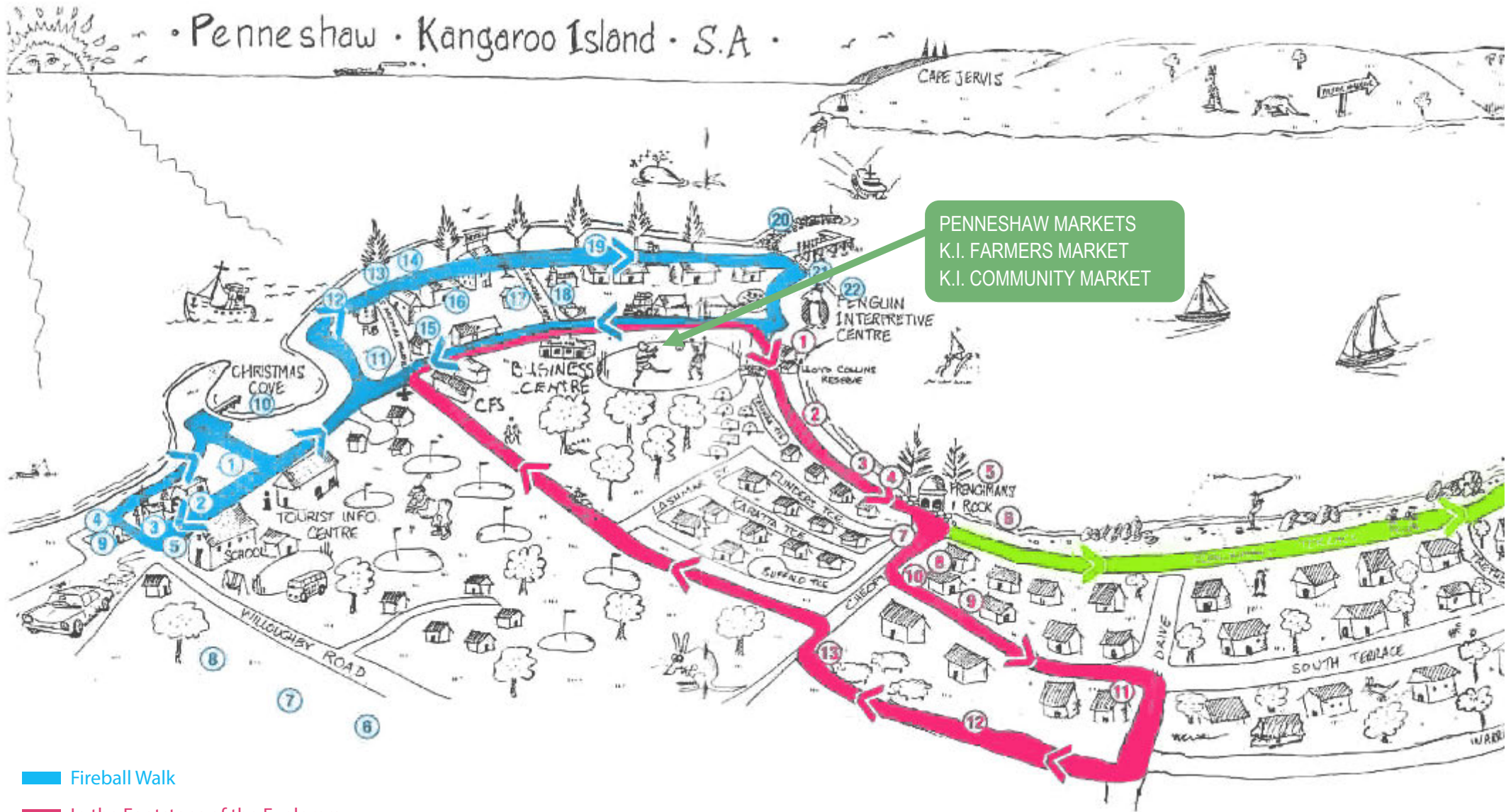

Fireball Walk

In the Footsteps of the Explorers

Baudin Park Walk

Walk 1 - Fireball Bates Trail

3 km. walk which takes 1 - 2 hours. Purchase booklet "Walking Penneshaw" from Tourism K.I. or Post Office for detailed historical information

- 1 Surbiton House**
Built in 1870s - occupied by Harry Bates family from 1889 to 1999. Old boarding house/saloon
- 2 Maritime Museum**
National Trust listed original school built 1869 - artefacts of settler families and naval history
- 3 Uniting Church**
Opened 1884
- 4 Fireball Bates house**
Is this the first stone house built in South Australia?
- 5 Stephen Simpson's cottage**
Built around 1900 by descendants of Nathaniel and Betty Thomas (pre-colonial Islanders)
- 6 Edward Bates' House**
Original house built in 1860 and extended in 1912 as family outgrew first home.
- 7 Former Post Office**
National Trust listed
- 8 Seaview Lodge**
Built in 1860
- 9 Mrs. Valentine's Cottage**
Built 1898 - has been home, store, butcher shop, post office and blacksmith's shop.
- 10 Christmas Cove**
Main port to Penneshaw during 1800s. Presumed landing site by Matthew Flinders.
- 11 Old Police Station**
Built 1909 (with two prison cells)
- 12 Johnston's Cottage**
Built 1840s (oldest existing building in Penneshaw)
- 13 Hotel**
Built 1903

- 14 Corner Store**
Now "Ultima Thule" the original store was built around 1900 by Sunda Singh, a hawker from India
- 15 Former Hospital**
Now "Granny Stirling's Craft Shop" built in 1909
- 16 Seafront Hotel**
Adjacent the SeaLink Office which was built in 1894 as a general store by Lewis Clark who also built the original guest house
- 17 Old Post Office**
Postmaster also operated as blacksmith
- 18 Aunty Ann's Cottage**
Private hospital in 1910s with priority to women giving birth
- 19 North Terrace**
CWA cottage/old boarding house dating to 1890s
- 20 Jetty**
Built in 1902 - in 1907 the SS Karatta commenced 54 year service. It was more convenient to shop in Adelaide than Kingscote for a long time.
- 21 China Stone and Clay**
An enterprise lasting 5 years but brought to a halt by flooding of clay mine in 1910
- 22 Penguin Walk**
Penguin rookery
- 23 Town Hall**
Home to Dudley Council from 1888 to 1996

Walk 2 - In the Footsteps of the Explorers

Early settler homes (see "Walking Penneshaw" for family histories).

Walk 3 - Baudin Conservation Park

Moderate hike of 4 km. return (about 3 hours) - signposted historically significant sites. Bullock track/threshing floor.
