



# Self-guided Heritage Walk

GO BACK IN TIME AND LEARN ABOUT PORT PIRIE'S RICH HISTORY AND HERITAGE



1. **Tourism & Arts Centre** - Formerly Port Pirie Railway Station.
2. **Masonic Lodge** - Built 1899.
3. **WWI Memorial Gates** - Built 1923, corner Gertrude Street & Memorial Drive.
4. **Navy Memorial** - Flower beds in the shape of an anchor.
5. **'John Pirie' Anchor** - Lost from the schooner 'John Pirie' off Aldinga south of Adelaide 1845 - salvaged in 1968.
6. **WWII Memorial Gates.**
7. **War Memorials** - Airforce, S-East Asia & Vietnam.
8. **Federal Hotel** - Originally called 'The Rising Sun Hotel' in 1898, re-named 'Federal Hotel' to mark the Federation of Australia in 1901.  
Retrace steps to park entrance & walk through the park to Gertrude Street.
9. **Memorial Park** - Boer War Memorial situated next to the rotunda.
10. **Northern Festival Centre** - Opened in 1982 contains a ballroom, meeting rooms and a 496 seat theatre named after Keith Michell.
11. **St Mark's Cathedral** - Opened in March 1953. Built on the site of former 1881 St Mark's Church which was destroyed by fire 1947.
12. **Former Bowden Timber Mills** - Thomas Bowden established his timber importing & milling business in 1883, closed April 2005.
13. **Former 'Recorder'** - (local newspaper). Building was erected in 1917.
14. **The BH Community Club** - Business established on this corner site by Symons Brothers 1899. Purchased by BHAS in 1940.
15. **Greek Orthodox Church** - Built in 1957.
16. **Mission to Seafarers** - Established 1944 - 1945.
17. **St Paul's Anglican Cathedral** - Built as St Paul's Anglican Church in 1899, declared Anglican Cathedral circa 1998.
18. **Carn Brae** - built 1908. Former home of the Moyle Family whose ice, cordials and aerated waters factory was adjacent to their home.
19. **Nyrstar Port Pirie Smelter** - One of the largest primary lead smelters in the world, the Stack is 205m high and was completed in 1979.
20. **Former Adelaide Steamship Company. International Hotel** - Built in 1874 and opened in January 1875 by James Henderson Howe.
21. **Court House** - Built circa 1880 became H.M. Customs 1964.
22. **Railway Station** - Operated from 1902 until 1967, National Trust and Heritage listed building. In the Museum grounds is the former Police Station - built 1892 and former Customs House - built 1882.
23. **Post Office** - Built on site of the former Telegraph Station approximately 1910.
24. **Shipping & Family Butcher** - (across road) Built circa 1899 as a Butchery for Sampson & Close. Now Sampson's Cottage is heritage accommodation.
25. **Former Public Library** - Built 1932.
26. **Portside Tavern** - (across road) Built in 1878. Once Pirie's grandest hotel. First named Royal Exchange Hotel.
27. **Barrier Chambers** - (looking down Alexander Street towards the wharf) Extensively renovated in 1984. National Trust and Heritage Listed.
28. **Family Hotel** - (across road) Built in 1904. National Trust and Heritage listed.
29. **Former AMP Insurance building** - (looking down Norman Street) Constructed in 1916.
30. **Port Pirie Hotel** - First hotel built in Port Pirie in 1873 for William Knapman. Now home to local shops.
